

UPDATE: Training Modules

Adobe has ended support of Flash Player on December 31, 2020. A new training system is being developed but will not be available this coming fire season. For the time being, please use an alternative browser with built-in flash and install the necessary web extensions:

The steps below assume that you do not have the browser already installed on your machine.

Using Microsoft Edge Chromium

Note: Audio plays back repeatedly if you do not select any options.


- Download and install Microsoft Edge Chromium Browser by going to the link below (You may be required to call your IT administrator to install the program).

- Launch Edge Chromium browser and paste this link to the search. This will take you to the Edge Add-ons page.

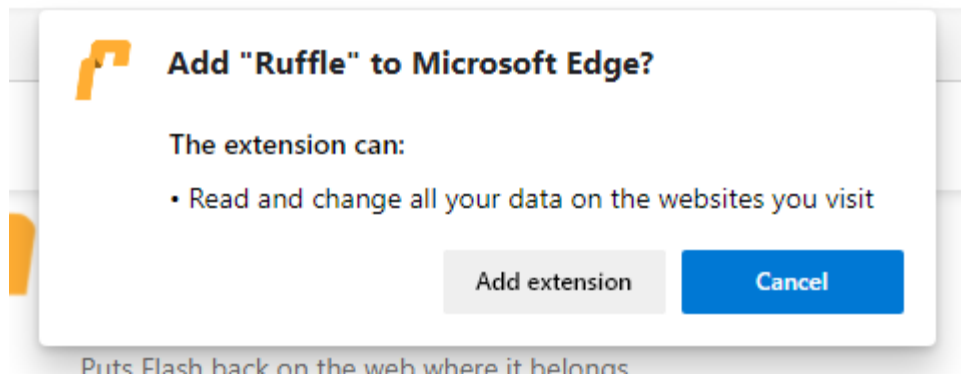

- Look for the program “Ruffle” and click “Get”.

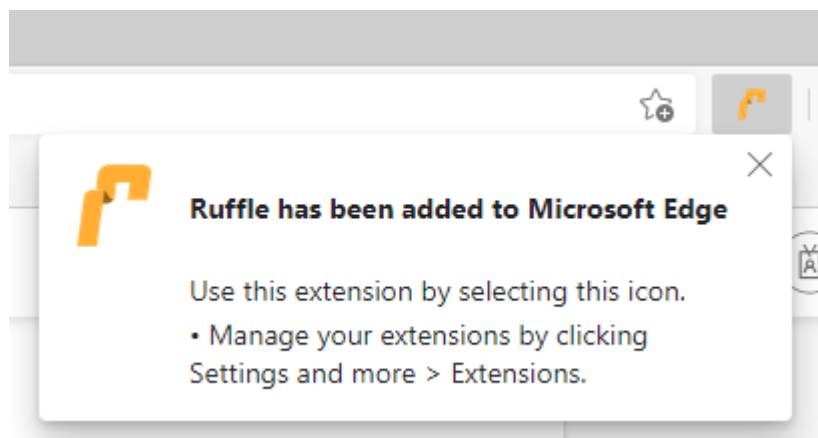

- Download and install Google Chrome Browser by going to the link below (This installation will require administrative rights to install the program).

- Launch Google Chrome Browser and paste this link to the search. This will take you to the Edge Add-ons page.

- Look for the program “Flash Player for Web” and click it.

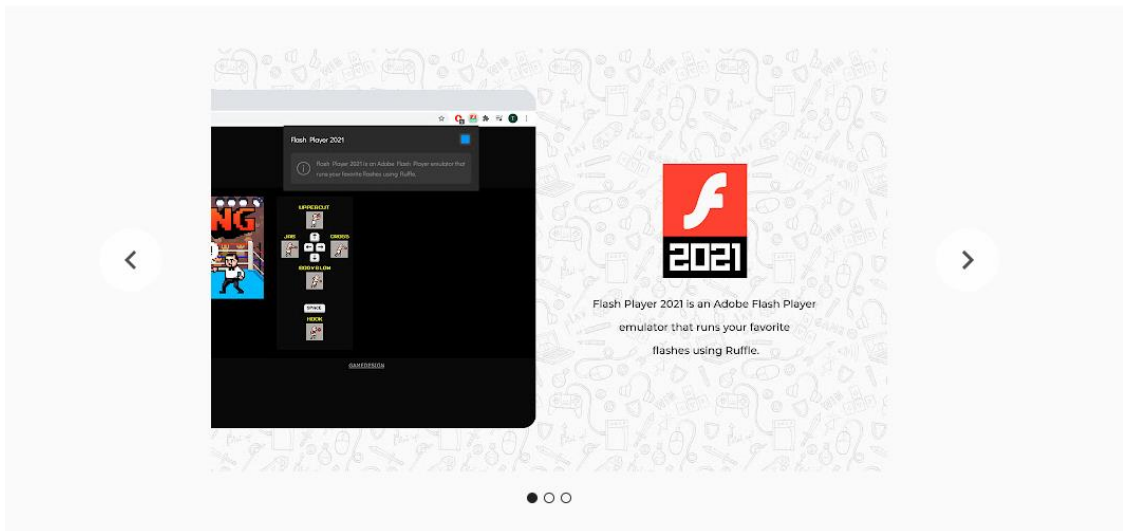

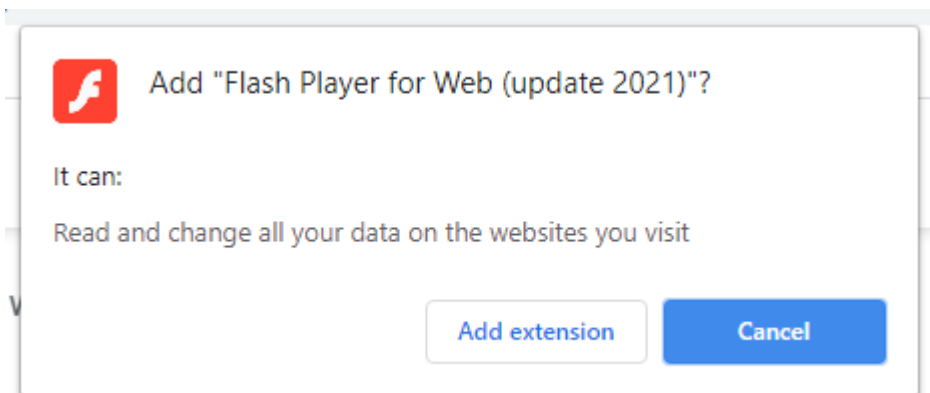

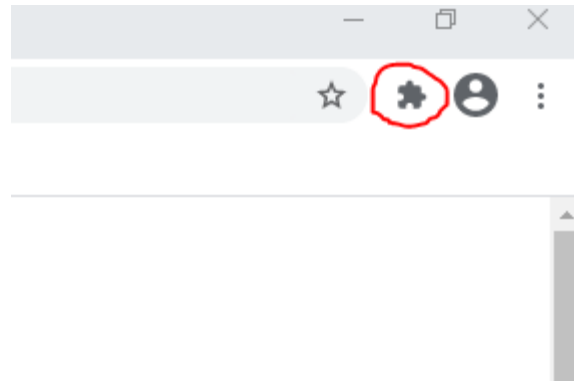
